SELECT EXHIBITORS TO EXCLUSIVELY FEATURE ONE-ARTIST SHOWS AT THE 2010 DALLAS ART FAIR

From among the more than 50 participating exhibitors this year, the Dallas Art Fair will feature three one-person shows. These distinctive installations will be viewed at noteworthy galleries: **Anthony Meier Fine Arts**, San Francisco, CA; **Carrie Secrist Gallery**, Chicago, IL; and **Jason McCoy, Inc.**, New York, NY.



"**Anthony Meier Fine Arts** is pleased to be doing a single artist booth in February 2010 highlighting new work by Donald Moffett," said owner Anthony Meier. "He will be featured in a mid-career retrospective curated by Valerie Cassel Oliver and Eric Shiner originating at The Andy Warhol Museum in Pittsburgh 2011; traveling to the Contemporary Arts Museum Houston in 2012." This presentation will be a unique opportunity to sample Donald's latest work such as *Lot 091709 (o)*, 2009 - a. oil on linen with wood panel support. A Texas native, Moffett now lives and works in New York City.

Carrie Secrist Gallery will be predominantly exhibiting Angelo Musco's projects at the Dallas Art Fair. Secrist Gallery's involvement with Musco's development has been especially rewarding. This summer, *The Hadal Project* won great accolade at the Biennale (a significant addition to the "Unconditional Love" exhibition at the Arsenale Novissimo). The overall image is comprised of 157 plexi-mounted tiles and is an edition of three.

"Over the last two years, the work of this young Italian photographer/ installation/performance artist has been on a meteoric rise. For the Dallas Art Fair, Musco will be exhibiting a special installation of works from the past year and premiering a new work to the thriving art community of Dallas," said owner Carrie Secrist.

"In order to best highlight our contemporary program, we chose to feature one of our artists who works in a wide range of media. The New York-based but Texas-raised artist, Rachel Hovnanian, works in painting, sculptor, photography, video and installation," said Simone Joseph, Director of **Jason McCoy, Inc.** Hovnanian's work offers a thorough and cohesive exploration of contemporary concerns, most recently how concepts of beauty empower but also burden women on a day-to-day basis.

The Dallas Art Fair will take place February 5-7, 2010 at the Fashion Industry Gallery. A preview Gala will be held on Thursday evening, February 4, benefiting Booker T. Washington High School for the Performing and Visual Arts. From mid-morning to early evening over the three days of the fair, visitors

may visit and purchase art from renowned art dealers and experts from across the United States and Great Britain.
